




SIGNIFICANT HIGHWAY PATROL APPREHENSION LOOKING BEYOND THE LICENSE PLATE

OFFICER	DESCRIPTION
Trooper Metzger	On 3/16/2009, Trooper Metzger stopped a 1994 Mitsubishi pickup truck for a cracked windshield and marked lane violations on CR2 in Fulton Co. Upon approach, the driver provided false information and further investigation revealed that he had a suspended license. Partially hidden components used to manufacture meth were observed by the officer including a propane tank and torch. Additional officers responded to the scene and the Toledo DEA was contacted to assist with the stop. Further investigation uncovered utility knives, aluminum foil, tubing, coffee filters, pitchers w/strainers, gloves, valves, and a partially filled oxygen tank with anhydrous ammonia. The suspect was in route from TN to MI to steal more ammonia from an unguarded location and transport it home to continue the manufacturing process.



2008 Statistics

- In 2008, the Ohio State Highway Patrol made 5,226 drug arrests. District 9 Troopers accounted for the largest number of drug arrests, recording 858 or 16 percent of the total drug arrests in 2008. District 6 was close behind (827/16%), followed by District Three (751/14%) and District Eight (565/11%).
- At the Post-level, Post 76 Canton recorded 312 drug arrests last year, followed by Post 45 Granville (199) and Post 73 Portsmouth (197). Overall, 20 OSHP local Posts recorded 100 or more drug arrests in 2008.
- Over 200 OSHP arrests for drugs occurred in Stark (214) and Franklin (209) Counties.
- In 2008, one in five drug arrests occurred in April or May (total of 1,088 or 21%). Over forty percent of drug arrests occurred on Fridays and Saturdays (2,166/41%). For all days of the week, midnight-2:59 a.m. was busiest for drug arrests (1,659/31%).
- Individually, the top six days for OSHP drug arrests in 2008 were the Fridays and Saturdays of holiday weekends including Memorial Day (90 arrests from 5/23-5/24), July 4th (86 arrests from 7/4-7/5), and Labor Day (76 arrests from 8/29-8/30).

2009 Statistics

- To date in 2009¹ OSHP has made 1,193 drug arrests. This is 48 more drug arrests (+4%) than in 2008. At the county-level, Franklin (56), Stark (55), Lorain (45), Ross (42), and Butler (40) counties lead the state in OSHP drug arrests this year.
