






NOTE: Data is from the Ohio State Highway Patrol's (OSHP) Records Information Management System (RIMS). Includes RIMS cases that occurred between 1/1/2008-11/30/2009. Data is provisional as of 12/09/2009. District 6 includes OSHP General Headquarters.

- From 2008-2009YTD (23 months), OSHP Troopers had 594 cases for felony OVI. OSHP District 9 accounted for the largest number of felony OVI cases during the 23-month time period (94), followed by District 3 (87) and District 7 (80). Post 47 Elyria (35) and Post 76 Canton (33) recorded the highest number of cases at the OSHP Post-level.
- At the County-level, Lorain had the most felony OVI cases (42), followed by Belmont (22), Stark (22), Franklin (20) and Scioto (20). These five counties accounted for over one in five OSHP felony OVI cases (126 or 21%).

SIGNIFICANT OHIO STATE HIGHWAY PATROL FELONY OVI CASES

In July 2009, Trooper Pennington attempted to stop a 1997 Mercury Pacer after a BMV check revealed that the license plate did not match the suspect vehicle. A vehicle chase and short foot pursuit ended with the use of a TASER. A search incident to arrest uncovered a temporary ID card that was used to identify the suspect. A BMV check revealed that the suspect's license has been revoked since 1986, he had numerous open license suspensions, and he had 15 prior lifetime OVI convictions.

In September 2009, the Cambridge Post received a call of a possible OVI near the Noble Co line. Trooper Buxton observed a 1996 Ford Mustang that was weaving across the road and nearly crashed several times. Upon approach, a strong odor of alcohol and several containers of beer were observed in plain view. The suspect failed several HGN tests and a breath test revealed a BAC level of .348. The suspect was found to be under an OL suspension, had an outstanding warrant, and had 2 prior felony OVI convictions.

In October 2009, Trooper Nelson was dispatched to a one vehicle crash in Richland Co. Upon approach, a strong odor of alcohol was present. The suspect failed several subsequent HGN tests and a breath test revealed a BAC level of .083. The suspect was found to have a pending felony OVI conviction and a total of 15 prior lifetime OVI convictions.
