


SIGNIFICANT HIGHWAY PATROL APPREHENSIONS

Trooper Romero Trooper Arnold K9 Ringo	Trooper Romero stopped a 1998 BMW 740iL with PA plates for a marked lane violation on I80 in Lucas County. Numerous criminal indicators and a positive K9 alert uncovered 30 packages of illegal narcotics in various hidden compartments, including 22 kilos of cocaine and 3.5 kilos of heroin valued at \$4.7 million.
Trooper Shannon Trooper Malone Sergeant Worcester Sergeant Schultz Trooper Romero K9 Hans	Trooper Shannon stopped a 2008 GMC Yukon for marked lane violations on I75 in Wood County. The owner of the vehicle was not present and a LEADS check of the driver found that he had a suspended OL. Numerous criminal indicators and a positive K9 alert uncovered several fake Michigan driver licenses, 17 debit/gift cards, cell phones, new laptop computer, 2 unopened Sony Playstation 3 video game consoles, and new men's clothes. There were no receipts for any of the suspected stolen items. Several occupants of the vehicle are being charged with forgery, and other charges are pending investigation by OSHP and the US Secret Service.



OSHP ILLEGAL WEAPON ARRESTS

- From 2005-2007, OSHP Troopers made 769 arrests for illegal weapons.
- OSHP District 9 accounted for the largest number of illegal weapon arrests, recording 127 during the three-year period.
- At the County-level, Scioto had the most 2005-2007 illegal weapon arrests (40), followed by Trumbull (38) and Franklin (28). Overall, 12 Ohio Counties recorded 20 or more illegal weapon arrests over the three-year period.
- Approximately one in six OSHP illegal weapon arrests involved an impaired driver (124 or 16%).
- Of the 769 illegal weapon arrests, 733 or 95% involved males and 36 or 5% involved females.
- Over one in four arrests were of individuals age 20-24 years old (199 or 26%).




OSHP Forensic File

The OSHP Forensic File is a monthly article generated by the OSHP Crime Lab. It's purpose is to provide insight into interesting submissions to the crime laboratory and to use as an educational resource for the field.

BLOOD STAIN PATTERN ANALYSIS

Bloodstain Pattern Analysis (BPA) is a discipline that uses the fields of biology, physics, and mathematics. BPA, in essence, is an applied science rather than a hard science. BPA may be accomplished by direct scene evaluation and/or careful study of scene photographs in conjunction with detailed examination of clothing, weapons, and other objects regarded as physical evidence. Details of hospital records, postmortem examination, and autopsy photographs also provide useful information and should be included for evaluation and study.



Some Blood Pattern Analysis FAQ's:

The goal of the reconstruction of the crime scene using BPA is to assist the overall forensic investigation in determining the answers to the following questions:

- ✓ What events occurred and where did they take place?
- ✓ When and in what sequence did the events occur?
- ✓ Who and who was not at each event as it occurred?
- ✓ What did not take place?

Relative to the reconstruction of a crime scene, BPA can provide information to the investigator in many areas, including:

- ✓ Area of convergence and origin of the bloodstains
- ✓ Type and direction of impact that produced bloodstains or spatter
- ✓ Mechanisms by which spatter patterns were produced
- ✓ Assistance with the understanding of how bloodstains were deposited onto items of evidence
- ✓ Possible position of victim, assailant, or objects at the scene after bloodshed
- ✓ Support or contradiction of statements given by the accused and/or witness

In addition to the above, BPA can be a valuable tool to use in crash investigations by providing information related to:

- ✓ Driver determination
- ✓ Occupant safety belt use
- ✓ Meaning of impact splatters on deployed airbags
