





Failure-to-Yield Crashes & Citations

Failure to Yield Crashes*

- In 2013, there were 43,926 crashes on Ohio roadways caused by a failure-to-yield (FTY)** including 155 fatal crashes which resulted in 169 deaths. Another 26,185 persons were injured in FTY crashes. Approximately 18% of all fatal crashes were caused by FTY.
- FTY crashes tend to be more severe than crashes with other causes. Thirty-seven percent (37%) of FTY-caused crashes resulted in deaths or injuries in 2013 compared to 26% of non FTY crashes.
- Drivers aged 16-25 were at-fault in 31% of FTY crashes. This is nearly twice as high as those in the 26-35 age group (16%). Older age groups caused even fewer crashes.

Failure to Yield Citations*

- In 2013, OSHP officers wrote 23,716 citations for Failure to Yield. This is 8% more FTY citations than were issued by Troopers in 2012 and 10% more than the previous 3 year average (2010-2012).
- Twenty-three percent (23%) of FTY citations were written as a result of a motor vehicle crash. Fifty-five percent (55%) of the drivers cited in these crashes were men.
- Nearly half (46%) of FTY violations occurring in 2013 happened during the afternoon hours between noon and 6:00 p.m.
