


OSHP OVI CITATIONS

- In 2015, 14,227 OVI-related¹ crashes occurred on Ohio roadways resulting in 395 deaths and 8,478 injuries. OVI-related crashes accounted for 35% of all fatal crashes in Ohio, a percentage that has remained steady for the past 3 years.
- According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), 9,967 people were killed in alcohol-related crashes in 2014.² This equates to one alcohol-related traffic death every 53 minutes. NHTSA estimates that the total economic costs of alcohol-related crashes in 2010 was \$52 billion.³ Crashes in which drivers were impaired by drugs alone add to these totals.
- In 2015, drivers in their 20's and 30's were at fault in 54% of OVI-related crashes while male drivers were at fault in 71%. Also, speed played a role in 60% of OVI-related crashes.

OVI-RELATED CRASHES

- In 2015, OSHP troopers issued 24,676 citations for OVI, essentially the same number as in 2014. Troopers have averaged 24,510 OVI citations per year over the last 4 years.
- Drivers aged 21-35 received 51% of all OVI citations written by OSHP troopers in 2015. Underage drivers (15-20) accounted for 8%. Male drivers were the recipients of 74% of OVI citations written.
- Sixty-one percent (61%) of OSHP OVI citations were issued between midnight and 4:00 a.m.; More than half (55%) of all OVI arrests were made between 5:00 p.m. Friday and 5:00 a.m. Sunday.
