




## PEDESTRIANS

### Pedestrian Crashes

- From 2010-2012 there were 7,611 crashes involving pedestrians in Ohio. Of these, 311 were fatal crashes and another 6,523 included non-fatal injuries.
- 309 pedestrians and 8 drivers/occupants died in fatal pedestrian-related crashes. These crashes represent 11% of all fatal crashes that occurred from 2010-2012.
- Forty-six percent (46%) of fatal pedestrian-related crashes occurring between 2010-2012 were alcohol- and/or drug-related. Of these, 69% involved an impaired pedestrian.
- Of those fatal pedestrian-related crashes in which fault could be determined, the pedestrian was considered at-fault 63% of the time.
- Fatal pedestrian-related crashes occurred most frequently during the hours of 9:00PM to 3:00AM (38%) and 3:00PM to 9:00PM (34%).
- Franklin County (1,332) led the state in all pedestrian-related crashes from 2010-2012 followed by Cuyahoga (1,130) and Hamilton (1,069) Counties. Franklin county (54) also led the state in fatal pedestrian-related crashes followed by Cuyahoga (33) and Montgomery (22) Counties.
