Troopers seize \$320,000 worth of marijuana in Wood County traffic stop

PERRYSBURG – Ohio State Highway Patrol troopers filed felony drug charges against a California man after a traffic stop in Wood County. The marijuana is valued at approximately \$320,000.

On October 19, 2017 at 5:44 p.m., troopers stopped a rented 2017 Nissan Maxima with Virginia registration for a lane violation on Interstate 80 near milepost 65. Criminal indicators were observed and a Patrol drug-sniffing canine alerted to the vehicle. A probable cause search revealed the contraband.

The driver, Quan Lu, 27, of San Diego, Calif., was incarcerated in the Wood County Jail and charged with possession and trafficking in marijuana, both second-degree felonies.

If convicted, he could face up to 16 years in prison and up to a \$30,000 fine.
