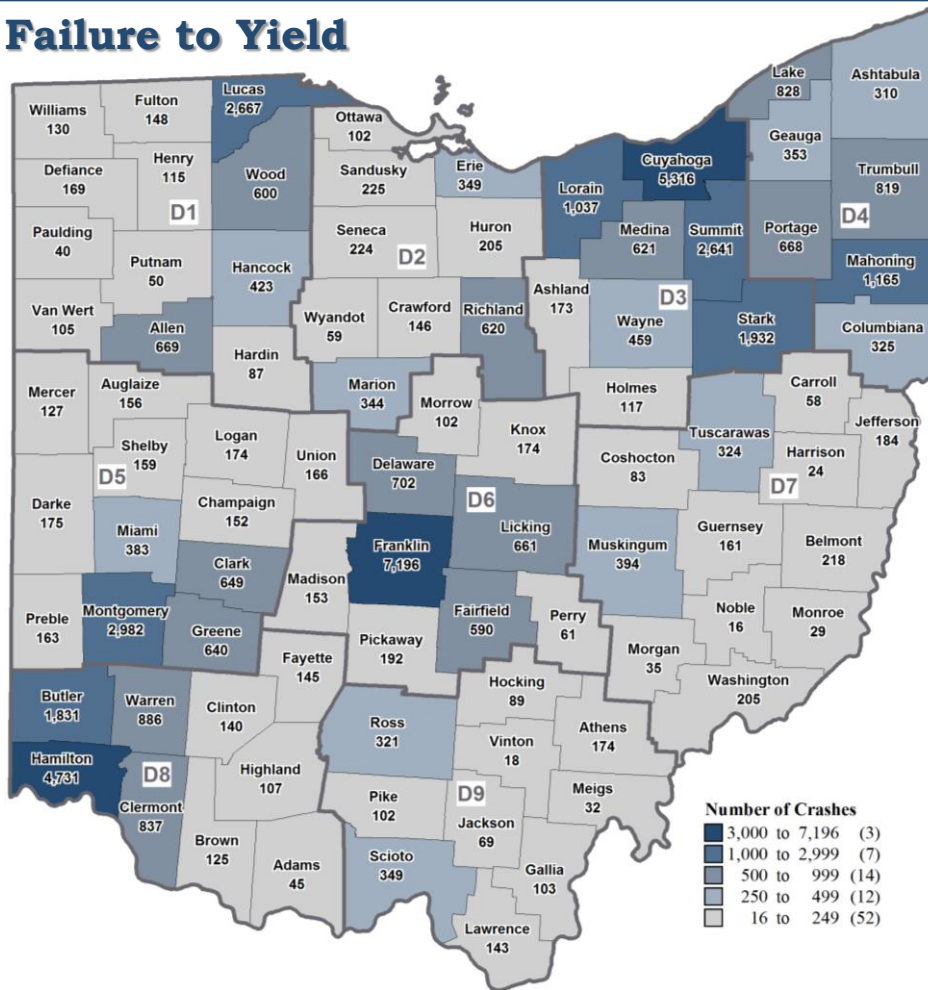




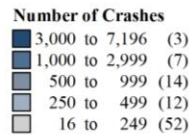

Failure to Yield Crashes¹

- In 2017, there were 51,976 crashes on Ohio roadways involving a vehicle failing to yield (FTY) to another.² This is virtually unchanged from 2016 totals. Failure to yield was a primary cause in 19% of all crashes in Ohio in 2017 or nearly one in five. One of every four injury crashes is caused by FTY.
- Among the FTY crashes in 2017 were 185 fatal crashes that killed 207 individuals. Sixteen percent (16%) of all fatal crashes in 2017 with a known cause were initiated by a driver failing to yield. Additionally, 30,443 people were injured in FTY crashes in 2017.
- FTY crashes tend to be more severe than crashes overall. Thirty-six percent (36%) of FTY crashes resulted in deaths or injuries in 2017 compared to 25% of all crashes.
- In 2017, 29% of FTY crashes were caused by drivers aged 16-25. Another 16% were caused by drivers 65 and older. Male drivers caused more FTY crashes than female drivers (51% vs. 46%).³

Failure to Yield Citations

- In 2017, OSHP troopers wrote 20,567 citations that included a Failure to Yield charge, slightly more than the year before. Twenty-seven percent (27%) of FTY citations were issued as a result of a motor vehicle crash. Male drivers received 61% of all FTY citations in 2017.
