




DRUGGED DRIVING CRASHES

- Drugs can have many detrimental effects on a driver's behavior. Some drugs like marijuana can slow reaction times while stimulants like cocaine or methamphetamine can make a driver more aggressive and reckless. Many prescription medications can cause drowsiness or dizziness.
- In 2019 there were 3,915 drugged driving crashes on Ohio's roadways. Franklin (431), Hamilton (307), and Cuyahoga (295) Counties accounted for more than one in four drugged driving crashes in the state (1,033 or 26%).
- Fatal crashes illustrate the danger of drugged driving. Of the 1,041 fatal crashes that occurred in Ohio in 2019, 369 or 35% had at least one driver or pedestrian test positive for an illegal or prescription drug. Nineteen percent (19%) involved drugs alone while 16% involved both drugs and alcohol.
- The number of drugged driving crashes increased from 21% in 2018 to 35% last year. The two primary reasons for the increase were 1) a revision to the OH-1 crash report that allows up to four drug results for each person involved in a crash and 2) a more thorough process to supplement alcohol and drug results for fatal crashes based on crime lab and coroner's reports.

OSHP DRUGGED DRIVING CITATIONS

- In 2019, OSHP troopers cited 5,215 people suspected of driving under the influence of one or more drugs. This included 1,386 citations for suspected marijuana impairment, 2,830 for an "other" drug impairment and 999 for impairment involving both marijuana and at least one other drug.
